

JANAURY 2021 (My Rotary Org)

January is finally here. As we look forward to 2021, our thinking doesn't have to stop at the end of these 365 days. Are you thinking ahead about what you will be doing in 2022, 2023 and beyond?

We cannot foresee the future, but we can steer ourselves where we want to go. I think it is important that every Rotary Club hold a strategic meeting at least once a year. Past RI Director Greg Yank, who has a lot of experience working with clubs on their plans, shares his viewpoint.

A famous aphorism states, "By failing to prepare, you are preparing to fail." Planning is essential to achieving success in all areas of life,

including Rotary, and we're getting better at it every year.

Strategic planning for Rotary clubs works. I have helped many clubs find that pathway by working with them to build what I call a blueprint, a multiyear plan that answers the fundamental question: "what is our vision for our club?" The best plans I have seen are those that are focused, when a club concentrates its resources on the best opportunities it has. Your Rotary club cannot be all things to its members and to the community it serves; it has limited human, financial, and time resources. A successful plan factors in assets and limitations to chart the desired pathway for your members.

Begin building a multiyear strategic plan by brainstorming with your club, asking, "What are our initiatives and priorities for the next two to three years?" Document your answers using action-oriented language that is specific, concrete, and measurable about the goals you want to achieve.

Next, narrow down your initiatives to a core set of three to five priorities. Your club will then develop specific objectives for each initiative, outlining who will be involved, key milestones of achievement, how progress will be tracked, and a timeline for completion. Keep your plan short and simple.

Then go out and do it. Review the progress you make toward accomplishing the initiatives, and revise as needed at least once a year. Rotary has a solid template to assist clubs in their planning, which you can find at my.rotary.org/en/documents/strategic-planning-guide.

We want to enrich and enliven our clubs with new discussions and ideas. But how do we attract the diverse professionals, from different backgrounds, ages, and experiences, who are all driven by as strong sense of integrity as we are?

Through strategic planning, we explore this question to define the very nature of our club and the value it offers to its members and to the community. Each club is different, and each club's value will be unique. During the planning process, clubs may also find that some of the activities they used to do are no longer relevant or attractive.

Once your club makes a strategic plan, it's time to take action and carry out the necessary changes. When we do that – as we engage members in vibrant and active clubs that not only have fun but also serve their communities with projects that have real and lasting impact – our clubs grow stronger. And when we discover what makes our own clubs unique and build upon those core values in all our efforts, Rotary Open Opportunities to enrich the lives of everyone.

ROTARY INFORMATION

Why you should care about Rotary branding

As a Rotary brand specialist, I see Rotary signs everywhere. I guess you could say it's an occupational hazard. Even my children spot Rotary signs wherever we go. So when I attended a local Rotary event in my hometown last year, I couldn't help but notice how Rotary's logo was being used.

When a club logo isn't used properly, it can create confusion and mistrust. In 2012, Coca-cola temporarily replaced the iconic red can with White cans that featured polas bears on it for the holidays. But they had to pull them from shelves when retailers and customers reported being confused. The cans looked too much like Diet Coke cans, and that's not what customers wanted.

This is one example of what happens when a logo is altered. By just changing the can color, the public was frustrated. They didn't trust the product anymore. And that impacts the brand.

Now imagine that each Rotary, Rotaract, and Interact Club had its own logo. How would the public know which Rotary club to trust, to join, or to donate money to?

When a club alters the Rotary logo – it weakens our global brand. That can impact our ability to attract future members, earn the trust of donors, encourage volunteers to help on our service projects, and even secure partnership opportunities. Old branding tells the public that this club is outdated. Inconsistent branding sends mixed messages of who we are. Studies show that consistent logo use builds organizational trust and awareness. Isn't that something we all want for Rotary – to be a trusted organization in our communities?

- Sec. Maribel gave update on RC Tubigon's Christmas/Outing in Bluewaters Panglao.


There being no other items to be discussed, the meeting was adjourned at 6:00 PM.

FACTS OF THE MATTER





EDITORIAL – The other viral outbreak (The Phil. Star)

Different vaccines against Covid-19 are finally coming out, promising an end to this once-in-a-century global scourge. There is another viral pestilence, however, that continues to call for urgent containment.

Pork prices went up during the holidays, and this wasn't just because of higher demand during the Yuletide season. Prices remain high as the local hog industry continues to battle African swine fever. The ASF infestation in the country is now in its second year. The initial scare abated as people were reassured that the ASF virus does not jump to humans, even if contaminated pork is inadvertently eaten.

The disease, however, is highly lethal to hogs, and highly transmissible. The infection has physical manifestations in the animal, which makes it difficult for hog raisers to sell their infected pigs, whether live or butchered for meat.

So the extraordinary containment measures implemented at the start of the ASF outbreak must remain in place. These include swine depopulation in farms or communities where ASF has been detected.

Hog industry players say 5.8 million of the country's 13 million heads of swine have been lost to ASF, wiping out an estimated P135 billion so far from the livestock industry. Luzon now relies heavily for its pork supply on producers in the Visayas and Mindanao, but what happens if ASF spreads to these areas?

The country's pork supply is 90% sourced locally, so importation may not meet the demand. Importing more meat also raises the risks of bringing in more livestock diseases, as the country does not even have a border inspection facility for frozen meat, fish, plants and other agricultural products.

Unless containment measures are intensified, thousands more hogs will be lost. The ASF containment protocols were laid out at the start of the epidemic. What is needed is strict enforcement, including thorough and efficient monitoring of all hog raisers in every community, from backyard breeders to large-scale operators.
