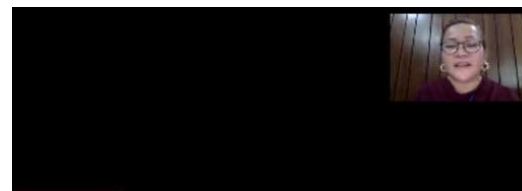


There is NOT currently a VACCINE for any coronavirus as most cause only mild illness.

Is there a vaccine?



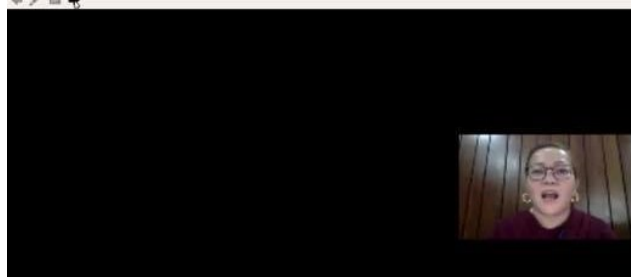
How is COVID19 tested?

Two kinds of tests are available for COVID-19:

1. viral tests or PCR test
2. antibody tests (Rapid Antibody Test)

- March 26, 2020**: [Image of a person]
- Apr. 21, 2020**: 1st baby (1) born to a mother admitted to Cebu City, Panamunihan, Ancestry in Australia in Virus Identification
- March 25, 2020**: 1st Public person admitted - 1st (1) UICEL (1) AGE: 1 (1) Exposed to Confirmed (1) (1) case (Died March 26, 2020)



CONCLUSIONS:

To achieve the citation :

- Select at least 13 goals (or more than 50% of the available goals)
- Achieve those goals
- Report achievement in Rotary Club Central

Club Profile

Organized and sponsored in 1991 by RC East Davao and chartered on 20 January 1992 with Sylvia Marfori as Charter President, RC Waling-Waling Davao is the 11th Rotary club in Davao City and holds the distinction of being the first all-women Rotary Club in District 3860.
