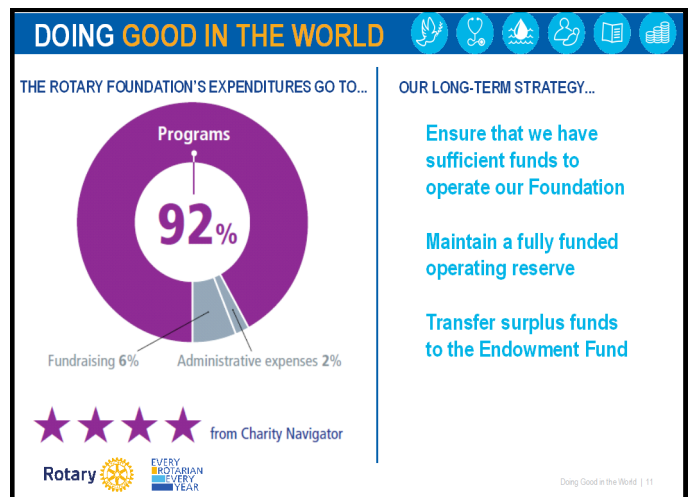

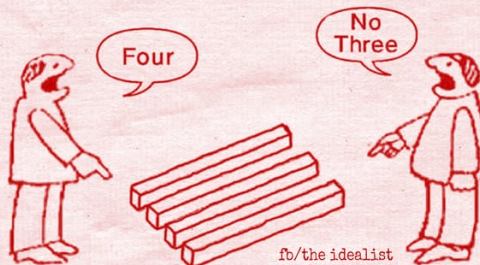

Good day Ladies !

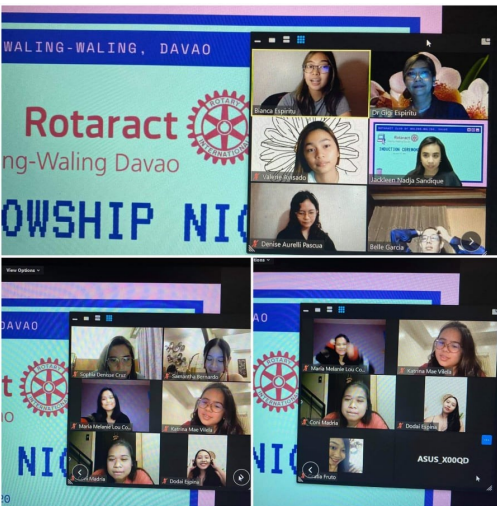

We share to you here some keys points in her topic "The Rotary Foundation".

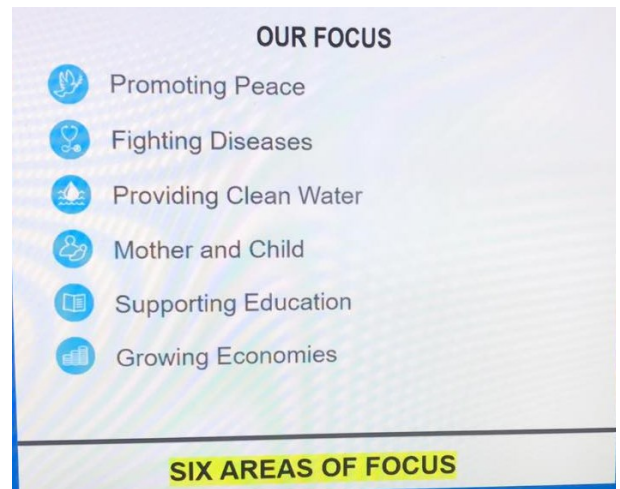
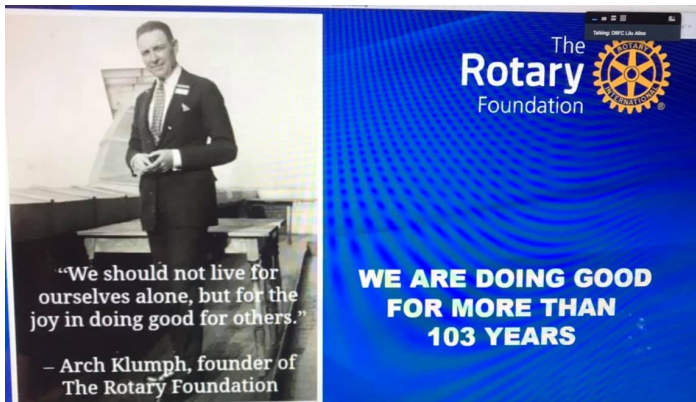
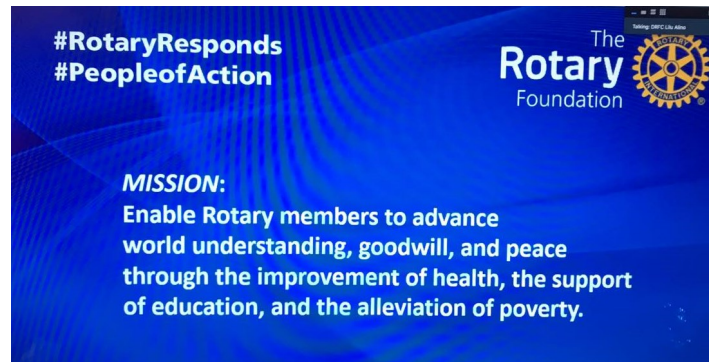
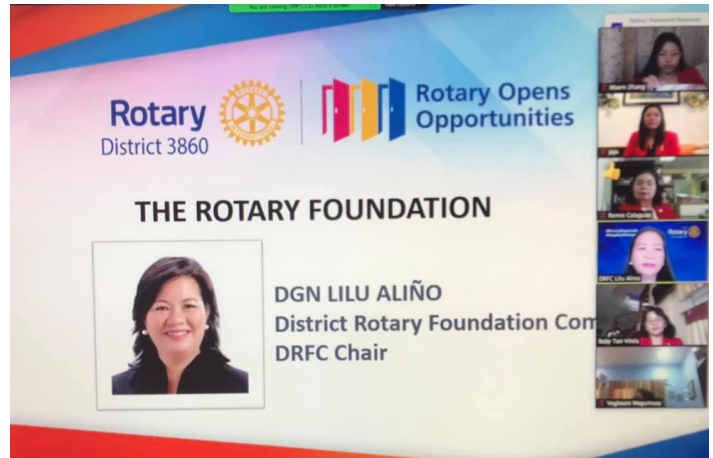
Her inspiring presentation shed light on the joy of giving which is the cornerstone of The Rotary Foundation for more than 103 years.

Our President also reminded everyone for next week's activity Rice for Life RC Adapt MOA.



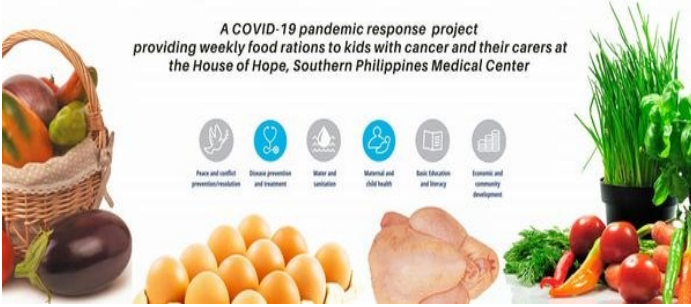

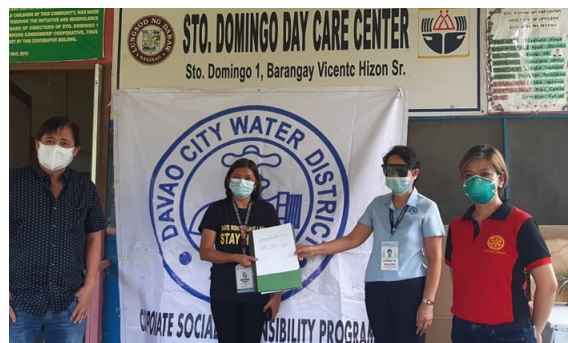

Donor Recognition

our generous contributions to The Rotary Foundation are essential to securing and growing Rotary programs throughout the world.

We recognize donors to express our gratitude for your commitment, offering individual and club recognition as well as naming opportunities that enable you to honor a friend or family member with a named or endowed gift.

Individual recognition

Rotary Foundation Sustaining Member

- When you give \$100 or more per year to the Annual Fund.

Benefactor

- When you include the Endowment Fund as a beneficiary of \$1,000 or more in your estate plans or when you donate \$1,000 or more to the fund outright. Benefactors receive a certificate and insignia to wear with a Rotary or Paul Harris Fellow pin.

Paul Harris Fellow

- When you give \$1,000 or more to the Annual Fund, PolioPlus, or an approved Foundation grant. To recognize someone else as a Paul Harris Fellow, you can give that amount in their name.

Multiple Paul Harris Fellow

Paul Harris Society member

RCC ADAP Village represented by its President **ALICIA FABIANA** herein referred to as the **SECOND PARTY**

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, RCWWD is a service organization that partners with different communities;

WHEREAS, RCWWD has established ROTARY COMMUNITY CORPS (RCCS) in different area in Davao City as a partner in implementing service projects;

WHEREAS, RCWWD had established ROTARY COMMUNITY CORP (RCC) at ADAP Village, Indangan, Davao City;

WHEREAS, RCC ADAP Village has committed to support the various activities of RCWWD ;

WHEREAS RCC ADAP Village had desired to put up a Community Cooperative within their RCC as a livelihood project;

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing premises the parties have agreed as follows:

- RCWWD shall provide a Seed Money for the livelihood Project, Rice is Life, by selling initially rice only to their members;_
- RCWWD shall provide continuous training to RCC members;
- RCWWD shall coordinate with different government agencies for more possible assistance to the RCC;
- RCC ADAP Village shall ensure the return of the Seed Fund within the period agreed upon, which is herein attached as Schedule I;
- RCC ADAP Village shall properly record all the data needed as documentation, and is subject to monitoring by RCWWD.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Parties have hereunto signed this Memorandum of Agreement this 5th day of November 12, 2020 at Davao City, Philippines.

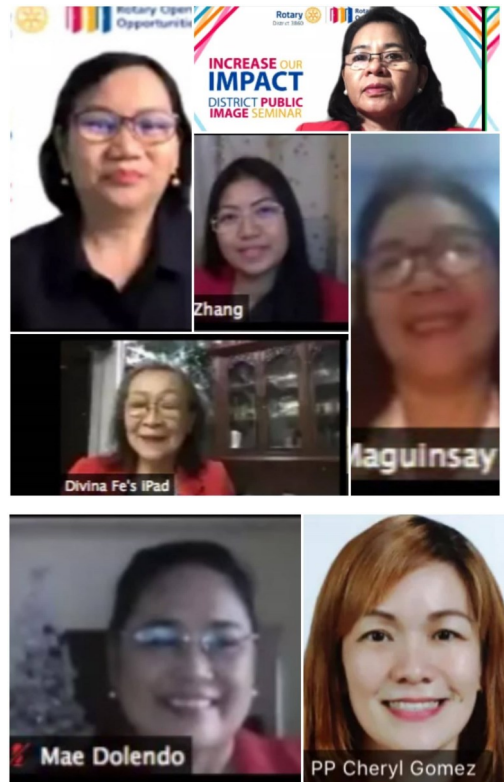

HISTORY:

At the 1917 convention, outgoing RI President Arch C. Klumph proposed to set up an endowment "for the purpose of doing good in the world."

In 1928, it was renamed The Rotary Foundation, and it became a distinct entity within Rotary International.

In 1929, the Foundation made its first gift of \$500 to the International Society for Crippled Children. The organization, created by Rotarian Edgar F. "Daddy" Allen, later grew into Easter Seals.

When Rotary founder Paul Harris died in 1947, contributions began pouring in to Rotary International, and the Paul Harris Memorial Fund was created to build the Foundation.

1947: The Foundation established its first program, Fellowships for Advance Study, later known as Ambassadorial Scholarships.

1965-66: Three programs were launched: Group Study Exchange, Awards for Technical Training, and Grants for Activities in Keeping with the Objective of The Rotary Foundation, which was later called Matching Grants.

1978: Rotary introduced the Health, Hunger and Humanity (3-H) Grants. The first 3-H Grant funded a project to immunize 6 million Philippine children against polio.

1985: The PolioPlus program was launched to eradicate polio worldwide.

1987-88: The first peace forums were held, leading to Rotary Peace Fellowships.

2013: New district, global, and packaged grants enable Rotarians around the world to respond to the world's greatest needs.

Since the first donation of \$26.50 in 1917, the Foundation has received contributions totalling more than \$1 billion.
