

The month of May is designated as "Youth Service Month" to focus on all Rotary activities that support the development of young people up to the age of 30.

Throughout the month of May, members of Rotary clubs, Rotaract, Interact, and those involved in Rotary Youth Leadership Awards and Rotary Youth Exchange celebrate the opportunities Rotary provides to connect, grow through service, develop leadership skills, mentor or be mentored, and have fun.

ROTARACT introduces many students into Rotary's "Service Above Self" message. These 18-30 year olds from colleges, universities and communities form Rotaract Clubs that change their campuses and towns through this selfless giving. Rotaract is great training ground for developing leadership. Students are looking for genuine ways to share their talents and abilities with others in ways that have lasting impact and Rotaract is the avenue for purposeful community impact.



Youth Services Month focuses on Interact, Rotaract and RYLA



Rotaract

Rotaract brings together people ages 18-30 in universities and communities worldwide to organize service activities, develop leadership and professional skills, and have fun.

Rotary clubs sponsor them, but Rotaract members manage and fund their clubs independently.

Rotaract members work closely with their local Rotary club, and may join after their Rotaract membership ends. ⇒Follow Rotaract on Facebook, Twitter, Slideshare, and Storify to see what Rotaract clubs are doing around the world.

Interact

Interact is a club for youth ages 12-18 who want to connect with others in their community or school.

Interact club members have fun while carrying out service projects and learning about the world. Interact clubs organize at least two service projects a year: one that benefits their community and one that encourages international understanding. While Interact clubs receive guidance from individual Rotary clubs, they govern and support themselves. ⇒Follow Interact on Facebook and visit Interact's YouTube channel to see what Interact clubs are doing around the world.

RYLA

Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) is a leadership development program run by Rotary. While participants can be any age, most events focus on secondary school students, university students, or young professionals. RYLA events are typically 3–10 days long and include presentations, activities, and workshops that cover a variety of topics, including:

- Leadership fundamentals and ethics
- Communication skills
- Problem solving and conflict management
- Community and global citizenship

President

As president, you lead and motivate your club, ensuring that club members feel valuable, inspired, and connected to each other.



What you do

- Preside over club and board meetings
- Appoint committee chairs and members
- Conduct club assemblies
- Create a budget and manage club finances, including an annual audit
- Develop a safe environment for youth participants
- Work with your district governor and assistant governor

How to prepare

The year of planning before you take office is crucial to achieving the objectives you set out for your club. As president-elect, you work with your assistant governor and incoming leadership team to set annual goals that support your club's strategic plan.

In this year you should:

- Assess your club's strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and risks in order to set goals
- Develop an action plan for your annual goals, which support long-term achievements
- Appoint committee chairs
- Ensure continuity in leadership and service projects
- Attend presidents-elect training seminar
- Attend district training assembly

- Immediate past president
- Assistant governor
- District leaders

Secretary

As club secretary you help your club run smoothly and effectively. You also monitor club trends to help identify strengths and areas for improvement, and share this information with club and district leaders



What you do

- Maintain membership records: <u>Update your club</u> <u>membership data</u>. Your club invoice is based on the number of members in Rotary's database for your club as of 1 July and 1 January. Rotary International sends the club invoice by email
- Record attendance at meetings and report monthly attendance figures to the district governor
- Maintain minutes of club, board, and committee meetings
- Work with incoming secretary to ensure smooth transition

Treasurer

As club treasurer you play an important role in your club's ability to carry out service projects, fundraise, and support The Rotary Foundation.



What you do

Manage club funds

Collect and submit dues and fees

Report on the state of your club's finances

Work with The Rotary Foundation
