



- Regularly update the Club Dashboard in the Rotary Club Central each time the club accomplishes a service project or club goal

Achieve at least 3 of 5 Goals

- All members must create and register your My Rotary account in rotary.org
- Submit the updated Club Constitution and By-Laws to the District Membership Chair
- Utilize various technologies to conduct meetings, communicate to club members important information, and record-keeping
- Submit e-copies of your club bulletin to the District 3860 website every 15<sup>th</sup> of the month
- Establish the club's Leadership Continuity Plan by submitting the next set of Club officers by January 15, 2022 for Rotary Year 2022-2023

Special District Citation: Participate in the Project D.E.A.R. of the Ten Philippine Districts by appointing one Digital Transformation Officer (DTO) in the club level



## CITATION GOALS AND INSTRUCTIONS



To be eligible for the Rotary Citation, clubs need to begin the year as active clubs in good standing – or having paid each invoice balance in full upon receipt. To verify that your club is in good standing, check your daily club balance report under Club Administration > Club Finances. You should have an outstanding balance of \$0.00. Invoices are due when they are posted, in mid-January and mid-July.

Rotary club leaders can go into Rotary Club Central and select at least 13 out of 25 goals they wish to apply toward citation achievement. This flexibility allows clubs to choose the goals that are most relevant and achievable. In addition, many goals will be self-reported by marking "achieved" in Rotary Club Central.

To achieve the citation:

- Go to Rotary Club Central
- Review the 25 available goals
- Select at least 13 goals (or more than 50% of the available goals)
- Achieve those goals
- Report achievement in Rotary Club Central

Once you are in Rotary Club Central, navigate to the **Goal Center**, select the **year**, and click on the **All tab** to see the goals.
