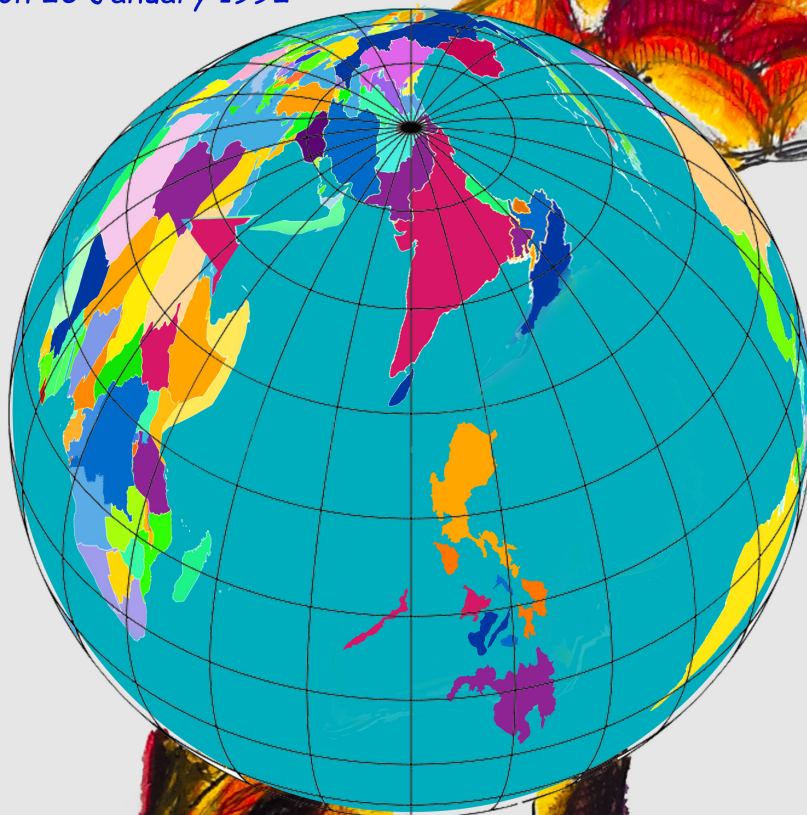

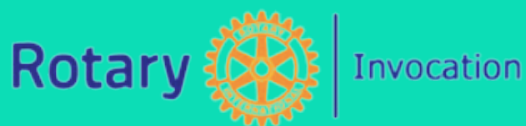

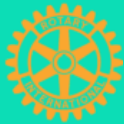

## COMMUNITY UPDATES



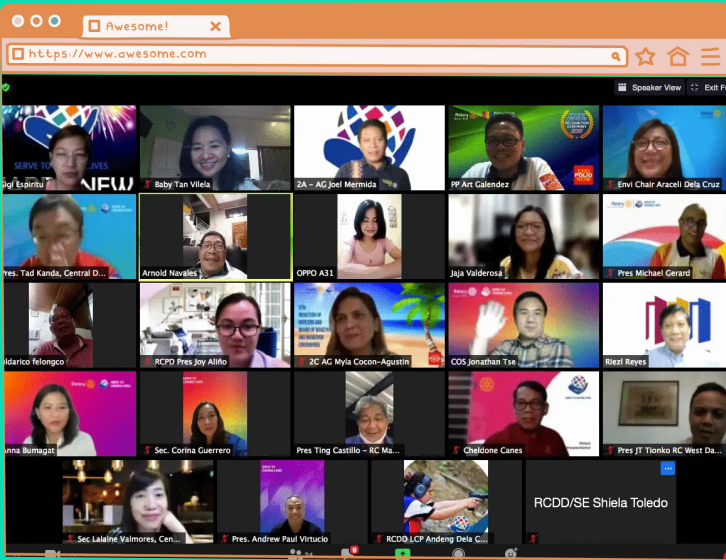

## VIRTUAL AREA COORDINATION MEETING



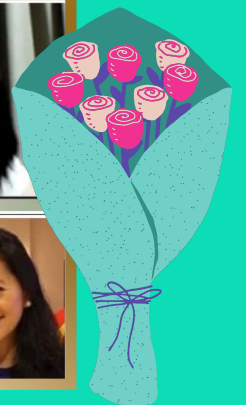

## 42ND INDUCTION OF OFFICERS TURNOVER OF THE ROTARY CLUB OF STA. ANA DAVAO

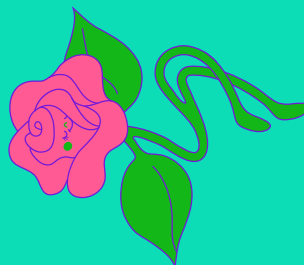
