Troy Bumagat is currently the Proprietor and General Manager of their family farm. Trophy Farm, which he established in 2011, employed integrated and diversified farming system. He believes in science and technology to increase agriculture productivity and regularly updates farm operations to promote efficiency. Adopting the farm motto, "A Place for Zero-Waste," he encourages waste prevention in farm management and consistently adheres to increasing the life cycle of resources by reusing or upcycling.

"Farmer-Troy," as he is fondly called, is a natural achiever and has received various local and national awards in pursuit of the excellence in farming. Among them are: The 2014 Regional Gawad Saka Award for Agri-Entrepreneurship; the 2013 Ugmad Award for Agri-Entrepreneurship of the Visayas State University; The National Silver Award for Outstanding Farmer of the Philippines in Agri-Entrepreneurship for 2015 and 2016; and The Regional and National Champion of the Department of Science and Technology Small Enterprise Technology Upgrade Adaptor for Innovation on Food Production. He was also a national finalist for all three awards for the following: Gawad Saka on Agri-Entrepreneurship from the Department of Agriculture; The Outstanding Farmer of the Philippines from Junior Chamber of Philippines and Harvest International both in 2016; and the BCYF Awards for innovation in Agrientrepreneurship.

He was a top performer for Chicken Integrators: San Miguel Foods, Bounty Agro Ventures, Chicken Essential Philippines and recently joined Danway Philippines. In recent years, he had developed his ideas of sustainability and care for environment by integrating Poultry Farming into Commercial Organic Fertilizers, Commercial mushroom cultivation and Hydroponics with markets in Region 7 and 8.

Prior to farming, he started as a naval officer and has served in the AFP for 21 years. He graduated from PMA in 1996 and has a post-graduate degree from the Asian Institute of Management. His agribusiness and appreciation of sustainable agriculture was enhanced by his education from the Center for Food and Agribusiness, University of Asia and the Pacific.

He helps farmers, both young and old, through his engagement under the Kapatid Agri Mentor Me Program, in coordination with the Department of Agriculture, Department of Trade and Industry, Center for Entrepreneurship Foundation, and Go Negosyo, and represented the agri-food sector of Eastern Visayas and imparting his expertise on Agri Supply and Value Chain, Marketing and Entrepreneur Mindset.

He is married to the District Governor of District 3860, Ms. Anna Louisa Abanes-Bumagat, and are are blessed with three daughters and a son.

# BTS' JIMIN DONATES 100 MILLION KOREAN WON TO ERADICATE POLIO

SEOUL, South Korea: Sept. 23, 2021 – Jimin, a member of K-pop boy band BTS, is supporting the eradication of polio, a devastating vaccine-preventable disease that once paralyzed 1,000 children every single day.

Jimin's donation of 100 million won (\$88,000) to Rotary's polio eradication program, will protect children in countries where the disease is still a threat.

"Thanks to the effort of Rotary and so many people, polio is coming to an end on this planet," Jimin said. "I wanted to join this historic moment to make sure no child suffers from polio."

Polio cases have been reduced by 99.9 percent over the past three decades, thanks to the efforts of Rotary, the World Health Organization (WHO), UNICEF, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, and Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance. Today just two countries, Afghanistan and Pakistan, continue to report cases of wild polio, and Jimin's donation brings the effort one step closer to a polio-free world.

"We expect the donation by Jimin, a member of the world's most beloved boyband BTS, will increase the global interest in polio eradication," said Rotary International District 3590 (South Korea) Governor Im-Sook Kim. "Rotary will keep the commitment of Jimin and other supporters in its heart and make every effort to ensure that no child ever suffers from polio."



The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

FIRST. The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service:

SECOND. High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

THIRD. The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, and community life;

FOURTH. The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

### **ROTARY'S SEVEN AREAS OF FOCUS**

- · Water and sanitation
- Maternal and child health
- Basic education and literacy
- · Economic and community development
- · Supporting the Environment
