- fresh fish donated by Dir. Ma-em Zhang.

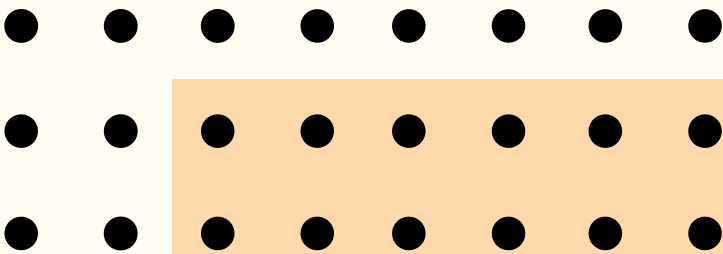
Child-Hope Field of Dreams Children Charity Foundation, Inc.

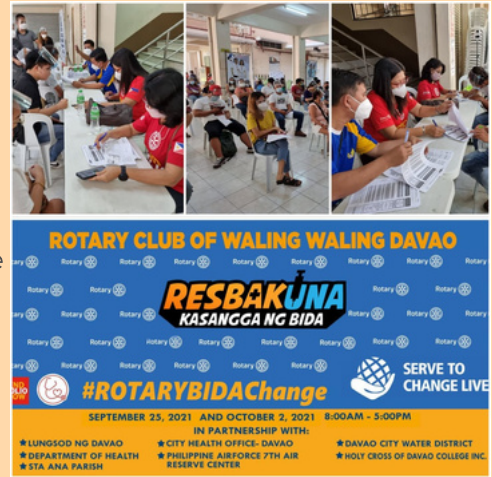
Resbakuna Activity at Camp Mercialdo Quintin

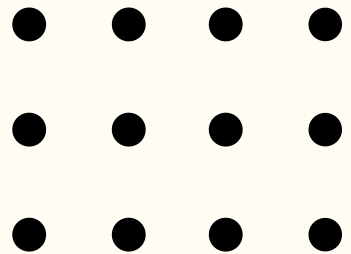
Resbakuna Activity at Holy Cross College of Davao

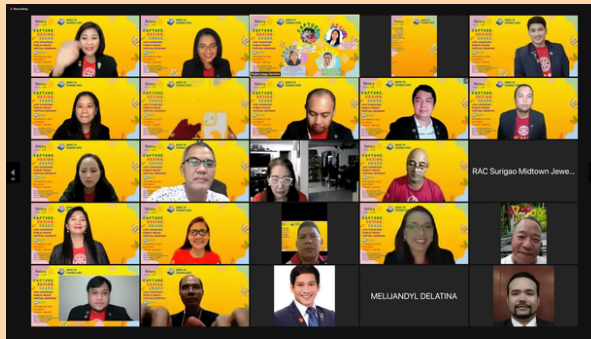

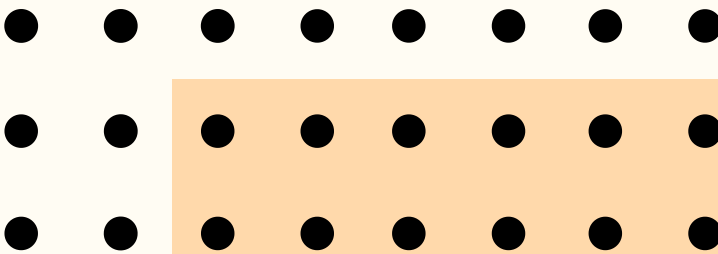

RCWWD Rotary Community Corps

The first and only Filipino Rotary International (RI) President Mateo “Mat” Caparas is renowned for his significant contributions to Rotary, particularly the worldwide anti-polio drive that has drawn strong support of Microsoft Founder Bill Gates. He is also recognized as the “Father of the Rotary Community Corps (RCC)”. RCC is a group of non-Rotarians sponsored by a Rotary Club, who share the commitment to change the world through community service projects. Through RCC, RI President Mat Caparas saw the potential of improving communities in lower-income countries like the Philippines.



RCC Duha

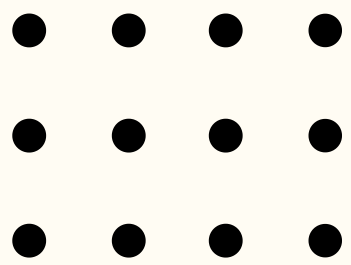
The RCWWD has a strong belief in harnessing people and communities. Over the past 30 years, it has established six RCCs in the following areas: RCC Agdao Yellow Village in downtown Davao City; RCC Tibungco at the Tibungco Resettlement Area north of Davao City; RCC ADAP in Indangan, Davao City; RCC Matina Pangil, south center of Davao City; RCC Tambakan in Toril, Davao City; and RCC DUHA near downtown Davao City.

Four of the six RCCs are still active to this day. RCC Tibungco has benefited from three Matching Grants, donations from the World Community Service, and help from RC Narashino, a long-term sister club of RCWWD in Japan. It is a venue for medical missions by local pediatric and medical societies and recently a beneficiary of the Rotary Global Grant 1640035 by the Rotary Club of Adelaide, Rotary Club of Prospect, Australia, Rotary Club of East Davao, and RCWWD.

have received, through the years, numerous training for skills and livelihood in partnership with TESDA and DSWD. They have also availed services from the City Welfare and Development Office, the City Health Office, and the City Planning through the initiatives of RCWWD.

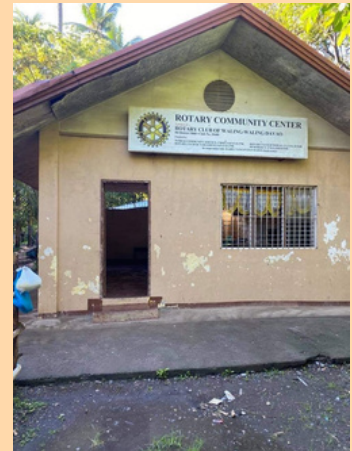
The four RCC centers are permanent structures provided by RCWWD through donations received from partners, funds raised, and a District Grant (DG). RCWWD has two daycare centers in Tibungco, a daycare center in DUHA, and a Community and Training Center in ADAP and Matina Pang.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, RCWWD launched a livelihood program called "Rice is Life." This project is a rice retailing initiative for its members funded by interest-free loans that are currently fully paid and enjoying capital from profits and continued the business.

RCWWD is launching the second series of "Rice is Life" this October, as Rotary celebrates Economic and Community Development month. By enabling and harnessing the strength of local communities, Rotary ignites a legacy of empowering people and changing lives.

RCC Tibungco is also a recipient of a concrete water storage tank donated by the Davao City American Chamber of Commerce and its donors, as well as the services of the Davao City Water District (DCWD) in cleaning and disinfecting its water supply.

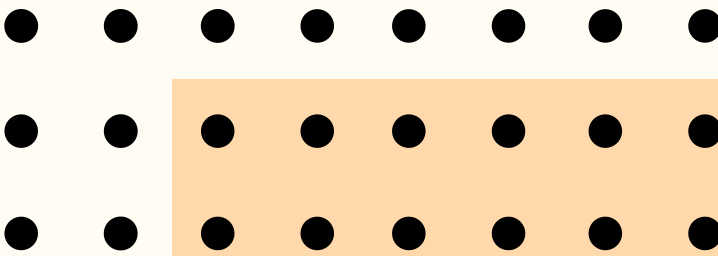

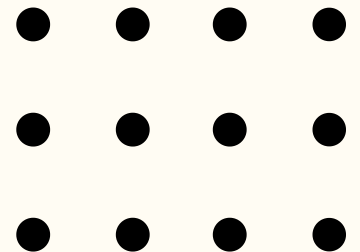
