



The House of Hope is a temporary home for children with cancer through a project of RCWWD in coordination with the Davao Children's Cancer Fund Inc.

It has served about more than 5000 children and caregivers since its inauguration in August 2007. House of Hope decreased treatment abandonment and provided a clean and healing environment for children with cancer

Vision

To bring hope, promote better survival rates and achieve excellent, holistic care for children with cancer through advocacy, research, and environmental protection.

Mission

Childhood Cancer Advocacy – To promote public awareness and education through tri-media approach, establish linkage with government and non-government organizations.

Holistic Cancer Care for Children – Better access to treatment through adequate preventive, diagnostic and therapeutic facilities promote psychosocial and spiritual support, and environmental protection

Training and Research – To promote training for medical and paramedical staff, create a pediatric cancer registry, establish adequate facilities for childhood cancer research, and find better ways of curing children with cancer. (acknowledgment: PP Mae Dolendo)




