October 6, 2022 - Training for the "Empowerment and Healing Through Art" Vocational Project



MOBILE CLINIC DELIVERS FREE HEALTHCARE FOR WISCONSIN'S UNDERSERVED COMMUNITIES

Rotary clubs in District 6250 (Wisconsin and Minnesota, USA) have donated a mobile clinic to St. Clare Health Mission, a community organization in La Crosse, Wisconsin, that provides primary and specialty health care services at no cost for those without access to insurance.

The mobile clinic, a shiny blue vehicle with Rotary logos painted on the side and front, was unveiled in August during a Rotary-sponsored evening concert, Moon Tunes, at Riverside Park in downtown La Crosse.

Josh Mansee, immediate past president of the Rotary Club of La Crosse-After Hours, one of the Rotary volunteers who drove the new mobile clinic and stopped by Rotary International Headquarters in Evanston, Illinois, recently, describes the vehicle as a "full-scale, full-service family medicine unit" which is equipped with two exam rooms, diagnostic equipment, and a wheelchair lift. "The clinic will deliver health care services, such as checkups and vaccinations, to many who simply cannot make their way to the land-based facility of St. Clare Health Mission," he says.

"This is truly a community driven project," says Rotary International Director Pat Merryweather-Arges. "The Rotary clubs saw a need in the rural community and they're partnering with clubs in other parts of the world and fulfilling the need."

Merryweather-Arges says nearly 20% of the U.S. population lives in rural areas where basic health care disparities affect millions. "When we talk about the underserved, we are referencing the economically deprived, the homeless, and a large immigrant population in the rural areas," she says. "Mobile clinics like this one are very important to the community because many people will not seek care, because they cannot afford it and lack proper access."

Rotary will cultivate a diverse, equitable, and inclusive culture in which people from underrepresented groups have greater opportunities to participate as members and leaders.



MEMBERSHIP SATISFACTION SURVEY

A Comparison of the 2021 and 2022 Results

This survey was conducted by the membership committee to understand and hear the voice of the general membership (GM) as to their satisfaction of being members of RCWWD.

Upon reviewing the results for the said surveys, here are some the following observations:

- There is a decline in the satisfaction of members for year 2022 compared to year 2021. In 2021, there was a 100% satisfaction rating, while in 2022, it dropped to only 88%;
- 85.7% in the year 2021 believed that club meetings are a good use of their time, while in 2022, only 80% believed the same;

- In 2021, 92.9% believed that the club did a good job involving members. However, there is a great decline in 2022 where only 68% believed that new members were involved:
- In 2021, 92.9% of the GM believed that members cared about each other while in 2022, only 84% agreed to this statement;
- There is a 10% increase in satisfaction as to RI updates and about 32% increase in satisfaction as to the length of meetings from the RY 2022 compared to RY 2022;
- There is a substantial decline of satisfaction in the club's service projects from RY 2021 to RY 2022, where the former year the club scored an overall rating of 100% on member satisfaction while in the latter year the club only scored a general average of 92%;
- An average of 11% decline in GM satisfaction was also seen from RY 2021 to RY 2022 as to the communication and responsiveness of the club;

- As to the value that the GM sees in their membership, there is also a decline from 96.4% to 88% from the GM who believes that they feel welcome in the club and a 13% decline in the GM who believes that they make valuable connections in the club;
- From 71% in RY 2021 the results declined to 56% in RY 2022 as to the frequency of GM participation in club activities;
- The GM still believes that club dues are just right for both RY 2021 and RY 2022.

As per the data shown above, there is an overall decline of membership satisfaction in RY 2022 compared to RY 2021.


