
# OCTOBER 19, 2022 - LIGHT FOR LIVELIHOOD: CANDLE MAKING TRAINING

# Scholarship Highlights



# **Progress in the Coursework**

As of this writing, I have already completed the taught modules of the MSc in Water Management and Governance. I am now navigating towards my thesis writing. Here are the four modules that I completed from July – October 2022.

# Module 11 - Water Resource Planning under Climate Change & Environment

This is a course I took under the MSc in Water Science and Engineering Programme. This discussed the expected impacts of climate change on water resources. This allowed the students to simulate water supply planning and adaptation and mitigation measures to cope with the ill impacts of climate change using the Water Evaluation and Planning System, especially along the fields of the Water-Energy-Food nexus.

# Module 13 - Research Project

This course served as the laboratory for thesis proposal writing. In this module, we developed a research paper based on the data collected during the international fieldwork in Montpellier, France (Module 9). My group have worked on "How does remunicipalisation impact public service: The case of water supply provision in Montpellier, France."

# Module 12 - Water Infrastructure Asset Management

This is an elective course taught for five days only but gave a comprehensive discussion on asset management as a crucial management tool in planning water infrastructure investments. The lecture was reinforced with a field trip at the WATERNET in Amsterdam because of its exemplary systemic asset management ranging from drinking water supply provision and pipe maintenance, processing water from the sewer and maintaining the sewer system, groundwater level monitoring, keeping the canal clean, and in operating and maintaining bridges and locks in Amsterdam.

# Module 14 - Research Proposal Development

This module ushered the students in thesis proposal writing. We submitted the proposal last October 12. I intend to do this research: "Sharing Transboundary Water in the Anthropocene: Examining International Water Law in Practice through the Earth System Law Perspective". This is subject to further discussion with my supervisor and mentor as to the selection of the case study area. I am set to defend my proposal on October 18, 2022. Afterwhich, I will conduct the thesis and complete it until March 2023.

# A New Weapon Against Polio by Jason Keyser

# A modified vaccine offers hope that eradication is closer than ever.

In mid-2017, two groups of 15 strangers lived together for 28 days each in a ring of shipping containers assembled in the parking lot of Antwerp University Hospital in Belgium. They had access to books and movies, a small courtyard for barbecues, a common kitchen and dining room, and a fitness room — all of it behind secure interlocking doors and under the watch of personnel in protective gowns.

What sounds like a reality TV or sci-fi scenario was, in fact, a remarkable clinical trial of the latest weapon in the battle to eradicate polio - a reengineered vaccine called the novel oral polio vaccine type 2, or nOPV2. The study aimed to evaluate whether the altered formula, the first major update to polio vaccines in about six decades, could help end outbreaks of circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus, also known as variant poliovirus. Such cases arise in rare instances when the live but weakened virus contained in oral polio vaccines circulates in areas of low vaccine coverage and mutates back into a dangerous form that can infect people who have not been fully vaccinated.

These variant poliovirus outbreaks have emerged over the past two decades as a significant stumbling block in the effort by




Rotary and its partners in the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) to wipe out the disease. The outbreaks are different from those driven by wild poliovirus, which circulated naturally in the environment for millennia and remains endemic in just two countries, Afghanistan and Pakistan. But the outcome is the same — the virus in either kind of outbreak can, in rare instances, cause paralysis.

In 2011, staff at the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, one of the GPEI partners, wondered if the live virus in the traditional oral vaccine could be tweaked to limit its ability to mutate. "The first challenge was purely scientific," says Ananda Bandyopadhyay, a deputy director of the polio team at the Gates Foundation, which funded and led the effort. "How do you make the vaccine more genetically stable without compromising its immunogenicity [ability to provoke an immune response]? That was really, really challenging."






