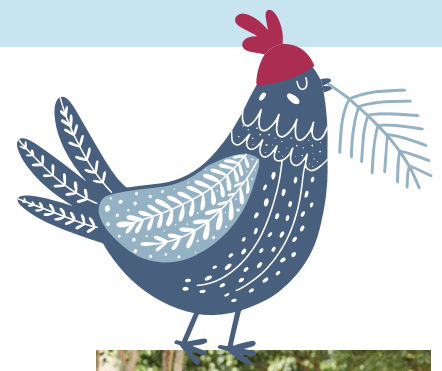

GENERAL ASSEMBLY

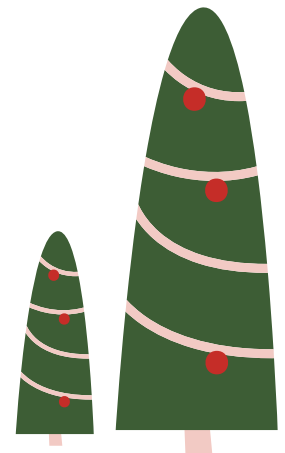
December 9, 2022 - The General Assembly of the Rotary Club of Waling-Waling Davao was held at PP Lorna Llamas' Residence.

THIRD, the application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal and community life;

FOURTH, the advancement of international understanding, good will, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

ROTARIAN CODE OF CONDUCT

As a Rotarian, I will:

1. Act with integrity and high ethical standards in my personal and professional life;
2. Deal fairly with others and treat them and their occupations with respect;
3. Use my professional skills through Rotary to mentor young people, help those with special needs, and improve people's quality of life in my community and in the world;
4. Avoid behavior that reflects adversely on Rotary or other Rotarians.

With a commitment to achieving lasting change, we work together to empower youth, enhance health, promote peace, and most importantly, advance the community.
