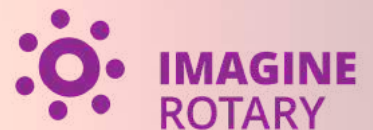

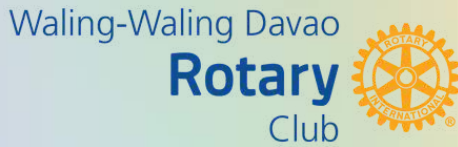

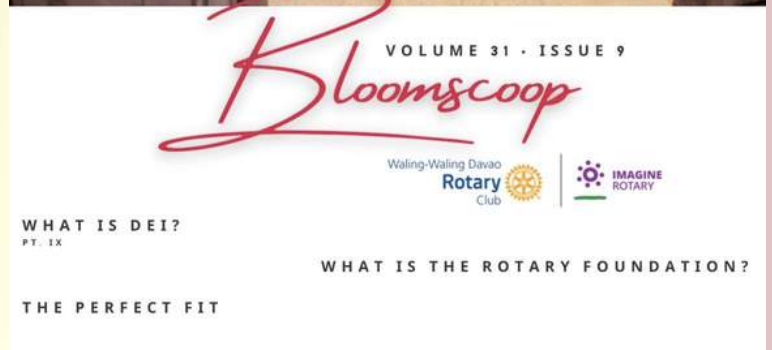

This recent turnover and accreditation with the City Social Welfare and Development Office (CSWDO) boosts the quality it provides to children's education, which happened last November 25, 2022.

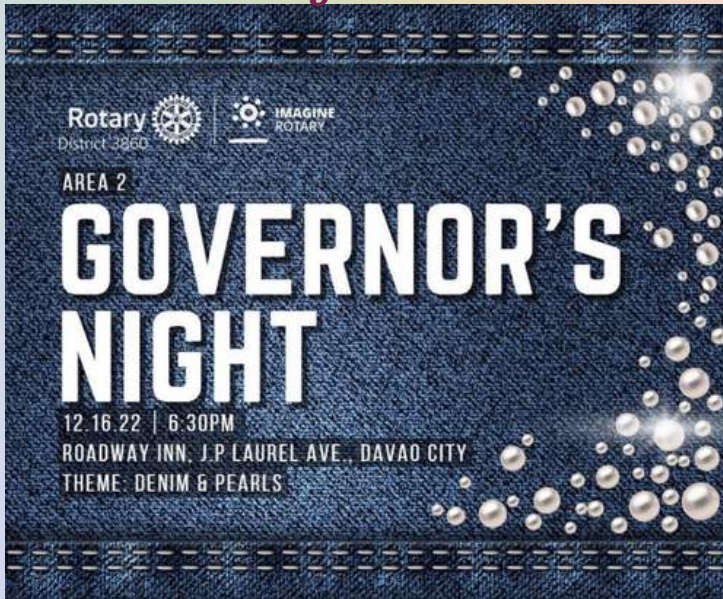
End Polio Now: A Climb for a Cause - Ain't No Mountain High Enough

- Holistic Cancer Care for Children – Better access to treatment through adequate preventive, diagnostic and therapeutic facilities promote psychosocial and spiritual support, and environmental protection
- Training and Research – To promote training for medical and paramedical staff, create a pediatric cancer registry, establish adequate facilities for childhood cancer research, and find better ways of curing children with cancer (acknowledgment: PP Mae Dolendo).

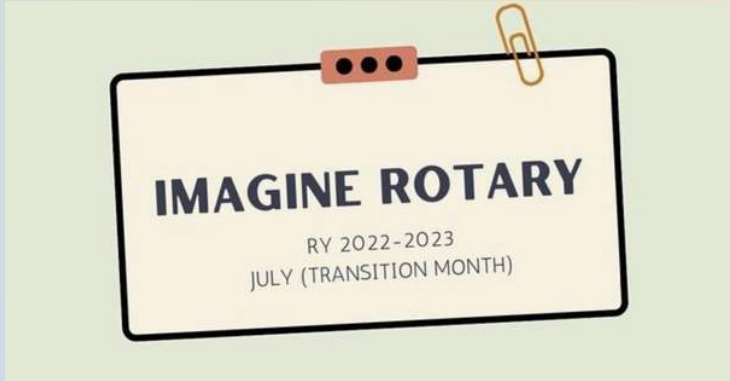
