




 Future for Mothers and Children

- Childhood Cancer Advocacy To promote public awareness and education through tri-media approach, establish linkage with government and non-government organizations.
- Holistic Cancer Care for Children Better access to treatment through adequate preventive, diagnostic and therapeutic facilities promote psychosocial and spiritual support, and environmental protection
- Training and Research To promote training for medical and paramedical staff, create a pediatric cancer registry, establish adequate facilities for childhood cancer research, and find better ways of curing children with cancer (acknowledgment: PP Mae Dolendo).
