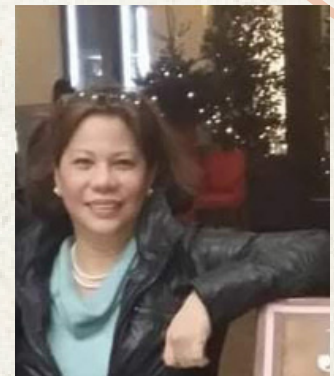

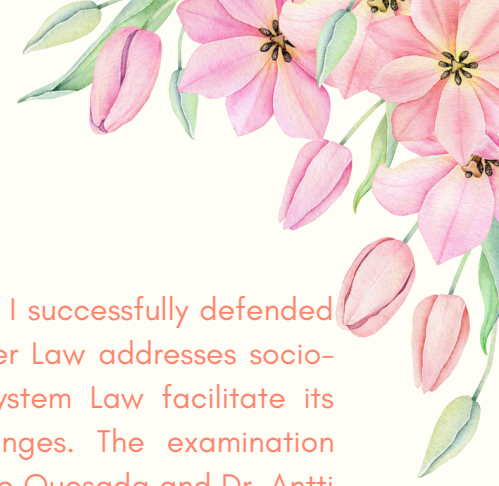

Thesis Defense - April 18, 2023



PROGRESS REPORT FROM OUR SCHOLAR



“Vini, vidi, vici” (“I came, I saw, I conquered”) (Julius Caesar, 47 BC). I successfully defended my thesis last April 18, 2023, which examines how International Water Law addresses socio-ecological challenges in the Anthropocene and how can Earth System Law facilitate its transformation to better respond to the socio ecological challenges. The examination committee composed of Dr. Susanne Schmeier, Dr. Gabriela Cuadrado Quesada and Dr. Antti Belinskij gave a very good mark and recommended the translation of the thesis into a journal article. As such, I was recommended to undertake the Advanced Class for the article development until July 25, 2023. This means that I will extend for another three months at IHE Delft, The Netherlands to produce the journal article starting May 1, 2023. This Advanced Class is funded by IHE Delft.

The 18.5 months programme for the 2021-2023 MSc in Water Management and Governance culminates last April 25, 2023, at the Old Church of Delft. There are 135 out of the 155 who graduated from various programmes. Under Water Management and Governance programme, 33 out of the 38 students graduated.

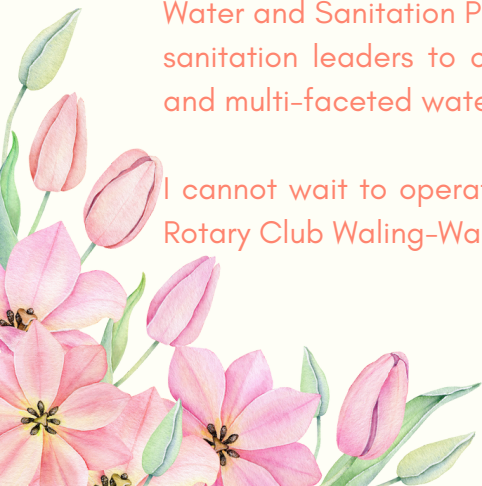
Certainly, the academic journey was not a walk in the park. The journey was bumpy, hilly and turbulent but I managed to surpass it with grace. I was still able to earn an overall very good mark.



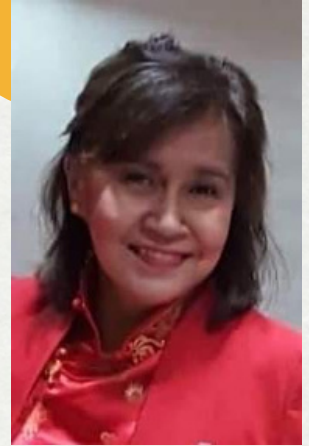
Graduation Ceremony - April 25, 2023

Leadership in Rotary

A Rotarian is generally speaking, a leader.

As a representative of a classification, some Rotarians already hold a position of leadership in their respective companies or profession.

*Hence in joining Rotary, a Rotarian merely enters into another aspect of leadership.
But not all Rotarians are prepared for leadership in Rotary.*

Rotary is voluntary and members serve without pay. There is no employee – employer relationship between club officers and members, and as a Rotarian leader, one must deal with highly diversified spectrum of people coming from all kinds of careers or professions. Members further differ in character, personality, age, economic standing, civil status, etc., that it is imperative for a Rotary leader to take all these into consideration.

Rotarians are busy people, but when a Rotarian accepts leadership in Rotary, he/she is expected to uphold what he/she had sworn to do without expecting anything in return; without mental reservation or purpose of evasion.

A Rotary leader must possess a high level of friendliness, sincerity (in service), tact and diplomacy.

*A Rotary leader must have the ability to persuade others through personal appeal, leadership by example, and by appealing to the spirit of service imbued in his/her fellow members but most importantly, in his/her commitment to **Service Above Self.***

Respect, admiration, friendship of fellow members and their assurance of understanding and cooperation should be earned not expected. A Rotary leader must be relatively knowledgeable about Rotary, must be familiar with all the Rotary International and Rotary Foundation Programs.

Prestige as a Rotary leader is for a true blooded Rotarian negligible. The right attitude would be just to follow the path of the 4-Way Test and believe in the Mission of the Rotary International

*A Rotary leader needs to exude a lot of enthusiasm, cheerfulness and drive. If one is a perennial complainer or displays a lot of negativity – like: argumentative, hostile, stubborn or self-centered, one will not gain the cooperation of others
Leadership in Rotary is an honor not sought for but given by the club members to those they hold high in esteem,, therefore it is a responsibility that should not be taken lightly.*

It may be fraught with so much stress and hardwork, but with adequate preparations, confidence and enthusiasm will set-in and eventually will become the strong motive power for success.

Acceptance of this honor has always a reward in the end – Service to Mankind. But remember, in God's spotlight, we can never be big enough to stand-in, so serve with pure intentions, warmth and compassion.

You only have one year to serve as a Rotary leader and it will never come again in a lifetime so you might as well give it your best shot.

Mr. Amancio Melad III, Ms. Karen Garcia and Ms. Jennife Borong completed their MSc program in Water Management and Governance, while Mr. Seth Nathaniel Linga did the same for MSc in Water Science and Engineering – Irrigation Engineering and Management for Food. Their graduation ceremony on April 25 was attended by Consul Irish Kay Kalaw-Ado. Ms. Ronaldyn Dabu and Mr. Julius John Dimabayao recently arrived in the Netherlands and are taking up MSc in Coastal Hazards, Risks, Climate Change and Adaptation under Erasmus scholarship. With Ambassador Malaya during the students’ visit were Consul Nomer Ado and Cultural Officer Elea Perez.

Established in 1957 and located in Delft, the IHE Delft Institute for Water Education is the largest international graduate water education facility in the world, It confers fully accredited MSc degrees and PhD degrees in collaboration with Dutch partner universities, and provided water education and training to more than 23,000 professionals from over 190 countries, with the vast majority from Africa, Asia and Latin America. Operating under the auspices of UNESCO, IHE Delft is a member of the UN-Water network.
