

In the last 32 years, RCWWD has accomplished 10 TRF Grants and 12 combined WCS/RC Narashino projects/4 District Grants; sponsored 9 and hosted 11 GSE members; sponsored 1 and hosted 2 RYE students; hosted 5 Rotarians on an Individual Friendship Exchange (USA & Canada); forged 12 sisterhood ties with Rotary Clubs in Australia, USA, India, and within the Philippines; organized several Rotary, Rotaract, and Interact Clubs, as well as RCCs; and spearheaded Zone and District activities.

Stand By Me: The Value of Peer-to-Peer Support

On TikTok and on campus, students with mental health struggles are finding support among each other

For years, Mary Lawal endured the dismissive remarks. She's just a moody teenager. It's just the hormones. She's acting out for attention. Someone must have gotten her period. None of the adults in her life seemed to understand that her flashes of anger, intrusive thoughts, and even her attempts to take her own life were signs of a serious mental health condition.

But there were people who understood, plenty of them, other young people who had gone through similar experiences. And after what she describes as "so many years of struggle," Lawal found them, on YouTube and all over social media. Her journey to recovery began there, with a sense of connection to people whose stories sounded like hers and who had found help. "I didn't feel as alone," she says. "I felt like someone saw me."

ROTARY SPEAKS

Now 22, the college student living in the Washington, D.C., suburbs in Maryland is in treatment and recovery for bipolar and borderline personality disorders that had gone undiagnosed for years. She has become a mental health advocate, sharing her story with audiences and leading youth peer support groups, and she is working toward a psychology degree.

Like Lawal, many young people are turning to social media to share their mental health struggles and seek advice. It's one form of peer-to-peer support gaining attention as a much-needed missing link between people with mental health needs and professional care. At high schools, on college campuses, on social media, and even within online video gaming platforms, young people are finding offering - support. Research i s recognizing that peer support can be important first step in overcoming barriers to care, including social isolation, mistrust of and difficult formal health care. challenging environments and other circumstances.

Schools, nonprofits, and other types of community-based organizations, including Rotary clubs around the world, are tapping into that potential.

ROTARY SPEAKS

"We need to focus on our youth," says Dr. Geetha Jayaram, a professor of psychiatry at Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine and a member of the **Rotary Action Group on Mental Health Initiatives**. "That spirit of wanting to do something for somebody else, our youth have it, and I don't think we're

harnessing it enough."

Last fall, Jayaram's club, Howard West in Maryland, and six other Rotary clubs in the area organized a youth mental health summit for students throughout the area. In an auditorium at Howard Community College, outside Baltimore, dozens of people young listened to speakers addressing topics related to peer support...
