
#### Build Peace Across the World

# VISITING ROTARIAN'S

# ROTARY INTERNATIONAL WITHDRAWS TENTATIVE SELECTION OF MANILA AS 2028 CONVENTION SITE

The Board of Directors of Rotary International has informed the Manila Host Organizing Committee (HOC) of its decision to withdraw its tentative selection of Manila as the 2028 Rotary International convention site. This decision was made as part of the Board's ongoing practice of reviewing convention sites between their tentative selection and the time when the Board officially confirms the location.

Among the reasons given for the decision, the Board noted the need to protect the fiscal strength of its convention reserves. Tentatively selecting Manila required the Board to make an exception to critical criteria – logistic, infrastructure and other operational requirements – that cities must provide to host the convention. While site selection policy provides the Board with the option to select cities that require exceptions, doing so creates an obligation for Rotary International to allocate US\$1.5m in convention reserves to subsidize any solutions needed to ensure the best possible experience for all attendees. This subsidy from the convention reserves ensures that Rotary bears the financial responsibility for operational needs arising from these exceptions, rather than requiring host districts to fundraise or for increases in registration fees to offset those costs.

In his message to the HOC, outgoing Rotary International President R. Gordon R. McInally stated that, with continuing uncertainty about future convention revenues as Rotary seeks to bring convention attendance back to pre-pandemic levels, "the general secretary has advised the Board to pursue lower-risk convention options" at this time. PRIP McInally also emphasized that Rotary members in the Philippines are encouraged to pursue a future convention bid.



Rotary International President Stephanie Urchick noted, "This difficult decision in no way reflects on the caliber of the work and vitality of clubs in the Philippines. From the time that you inspired us to follow your lead and take on the challenge of eradicating polio country by country, Rotary has continued to value highly the contributions of its members in the Philippines."

RI President Urchick recognized the efforts of the Manila Host Organizing Committee (HOC) in securing the bid and preparing the groundwork for hosting. She recalled her cordial meeting with His Excellency, President Ferdinand R. Marcos, Jr. at Malacañang Palace in October of 2023, at which the latter expressed elation that the Philippines had been tentatively selected as the event host. She also noted the warm reception accorded to her predecessor, Past RI President R. Gordon R. McInally, by the Honorable Ferdinand Martin Romualdez, Speaker of the House of Representatives, accompanied by past officers of RI who are incumbent house members.

Manila HOC Chair Samuel Pagdilao, Jr. acknowledged the notice and stated: "The Manila HOC is saddened with this withdrawal decision of the RI Board but fully understands its position. We have written a letter to RI President Urchick that provides a comprehensive account of the Manila HOC's preparatory work and its earnest effort to abide by RI's requirements for convention host and seeks reconsideration."

Rotary International President Urchick thanked all involved in the decision for the care and attention they paid to this challenging task. "I know this was a difficult decision to make and equally difficult news to receive, and I want to thank everyone involved for their teamwork and deep dedication to Rotary.

Rotary and Rotaract clubs can now designate a Programs for Young Leaders contact. And Interact club presidents can (with a parent's consent) complete an optional self-registration form to receive resources and support directly from Rotary International. Both of these changes will help clubs and youth programs expand and grow stronger in part by enabling RI to distribute tools and information to club contacts. The Programs for Young Leaders contacts will stay connected with all of the youth programs their club sponsors, amplifying participants' ideas and input and advocating for safe, inclusive programs. They will also serve as the main contact for any Interact clubs their club sponsors, attend Interact meetings, and find opportunities for Interactors to attend the sponsor club's meetings and activities. 
