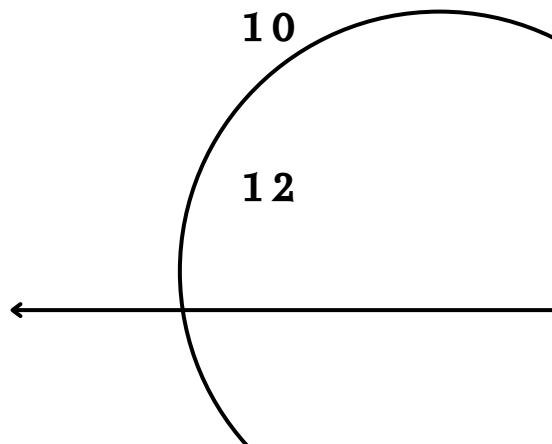

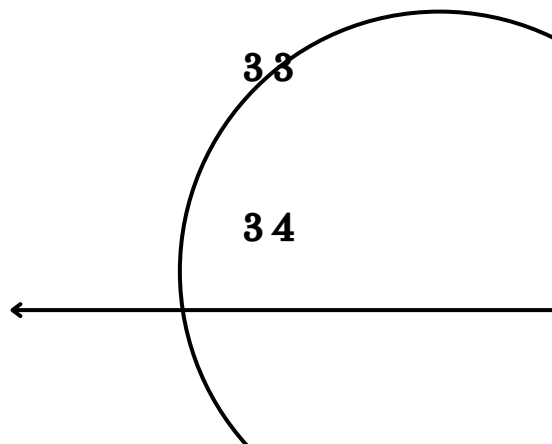

I especially want to draw your attention to the Club Excellence Award – which is the new name for the Rotary Citation. Each year, Rotary, Rotaract, and Interact clubs can earn this prestigious award for all-around excellence by setting and achieving goals that strengthen the club, its district, and Rotary. When at least 50% of the Rotary clubs in a district earn the Club Excellence Award, the district earns the District Excellence Award. You can find the club excellence goals for Rotary, Rotaract, and Interact clubs, as well as FAQs and more, at rotary.org/ClubExcellence. And then track your club or district's progress with the [Rotary Club Excellence Recipients Report](#).

We encourage you to start thinking about recognition early in your term, so you don't miss an opportunity to motivate and recognize those club members, community members, and clubs that are making an impact.

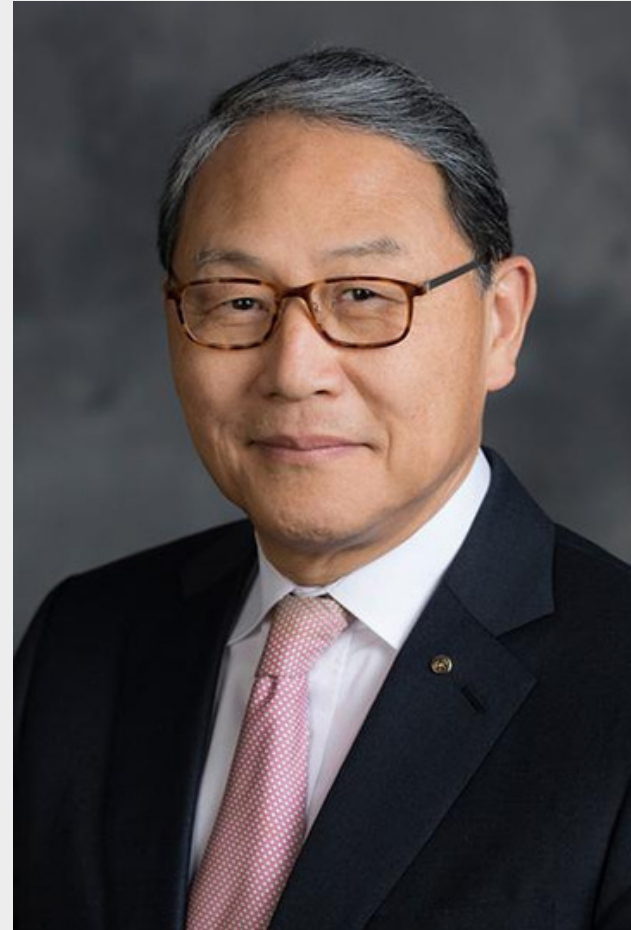


SANGKOO YUN IS SELECTED TO BE 2026-27 ROTARY INTERNATIONAL PRESIDENT

He also served on The Rotary Foundation's Executive Committee (2019-22, chair 2020-21) and Programs Committee (2019-22, chair 2020-22).

Yun received The Rotary Foundation's Distinguished Service Award in 2021-22. He was appointed an Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire by Queen Elizabeth II, awarded the Friendship Medal by the president of Mongolia, and recognized for distinguished services by the president and prime minister of Korea. He is a veteran of the Republic of Korea Army and an emeritus elder at Andong Presbyterian Church.

Yun and his spouse, Eunsun, are Rotary Foundation Benefactors, Major Donors, and members of the Arch Klumph Society, the Paul Harris Society, and the Bequest Society. They have two children.

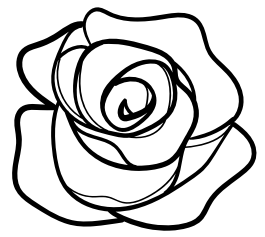
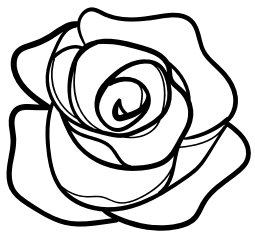
