Rotary year-end is fast approaching! As we approach the end of this Rotary year, I want to take a moment to thank you for your leadership in Club of Waling-Waling (Davao). Your dedication has made a meaningful impact, and we appreciate all you've done to support The Rotary Foundation.

While you've likely accomplished many of your goals, the final months of the Rotary year are often the busiest—and the most crucial—for Foundation giving. Throughout the year, Mark's Magical Markers have provided a way to prioritize fundraising, and today, we highlight one of the most urgent: giving to the PolioPlus Fund.

There are moments in our journey to end polio when doubt and uncertainty may take hold, yet we must remain steadfast and, above all, hopeful as we keep our eyes on the goal. Since 1988 when we partnered with organizations around the world to form the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI), we have reduced wild poliovirus cases by 99.9%.

Our progress has been remarkable, but the journey has not been without challenges. In Rotary, we always rise to meet the moment— no challenge is too great, no barrier too strong. And until polio is eradicated everywhere, it is a threat anywhere.

Today in Afghanistan, house-to-house immunization campaigns are prohibited, while in Pakistan, conflict, insecurity, and migration limit access to children. Yet, we rise to the challenge—just as we did in India, before the country was declared wild polio-free in 2014. In Nigeria, we faced similar obstacles, but in 2020 all of Africa was certified wild poliovirus-free.

Now, in 2025, we press forward with unwavering resolve. We have come too far to turn back. This week is World Immunization Week, a reminder of how close we are to eradicating polio—but we're not there yet.

OUR PROGRESS IN THE FIGHT AGAINST POLIO SHOWS WHY VACCINATION IS IMPORTANT

Increasing awareness about the power of vaccines and closing immunization gaps could protect millions of people worldwide from vaccine-preventable diseases, including polio, according to the World Health Organization. <u>World Immunization Week</u>, 24–30 April, is an opportunity to focus on that work, and the robust polio eradication infrastructure built by Rotary and our partners in the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) provides a model for it.

The GPEI estimates that polio vaccines have saved an estimated 20 million children around the world from paralysis. When Rotary helped launch the GPEI in 1988, the disease paralyzed more than 1,000 people worldwide every day, most of them young children. Since then, Rotary and its partners have reduced the number of polio cases by 99%, and so far in 2025, there are just eight cases of polio caused by the wild poliovirus. Afghanistan and Pakistan are the only two countries where the wild poliovirus remains endemic.


The progress against polio is the result of the efforts of countless volunteers and health workers who immunize children in hard-to-reach communities and establish real-time global surveillance and outbreak response mechanisms. The polio eradication infrastructure has been used to fight other infectious diseases and undertake crucial health interventions, including supporting COVID-19 prevention and vaccination efforts.

With our decades of experience in bringing polio to the brink of eradication, Rotary has been able to highlight the power and efficacy of COVID-19 vaccines. Since the pandemic began in 2020, Rotary members have helped health authorities communicate lifesaving information about COVID-19, dispel misinformation, and support fair and equal access to vaccines.




