Together with members and donors, our Foundation is helping to keep communities strong and healthy. So far this Rotary year, we've helped fund 458 district grants. One example is in Canada where pollinator gardens of native perennials were installed to help protect the environment by supporting biodiversity and helping to restore native ecosystems.

Among the 1,210 global grants we supported, one in the Dominican Republic distributed water filters so people have access to clean water. In addition, 69 disaster response grants have helped communities recover from crises. An effort in Peru supplied tents, cots, and mattresses to firefighters responding to wildfires.
