Dear Beauteous Ladies in Red,

I would like to begin by expressing my deepest gratitude to all of you for your quick and wholehearted approval of the cash donation for our kababayans in Cebu who were severely affected by the recent floods. Your generosity and compassion once again proved that our club is not just an organization, it is a family bound by service and love for others.

Last November 8, I had the opportunity to personally deliver the relief goods to some of the hardest-hit areas. Nothing could have prepared me for what I witnessed. The roads were still muddy, the air heavy with the smell of damp earth and loss. Families stood beside what was left of their homes—makeshift shelters of tarpaulins and salvaged wood. Mothers held their children close, unsure of what tomorrow might bring.

Yet, in the midst of all that pain, I saw hope. When we handed them the relief packs, I saw tears in their eyes, not only of sorrow but of gratitude. One elderly man clasped my hands tightly and whispered, "Salamat gyud inyo mi nahinumduman." The 4th climb for a cause to End polio was in collaboration with District 3310 with 10 Rotarian climbers from 7 Rotary Clubs (RC Bandar Seri Begawan, RC Kuching Central, RC Meri, RC Sarikei, RC Sibu, RC Singapore North, RC Singapore) and District 3860 with 10 Rotarian climbers from 4 Rotary Clubs (RC Bislig, RC Koronadal, RC Mandaue, and RC Waling Waling Davao). The climb was open to non-Rotarians as well; there were 8 friends of Rotary who joined the climb, bringing the total to 28 climbers. The climb package was 3D2N for RM 2,900 and was handled by Borneo Calling, a registered outdoor event organizer in Sabah, Malaysia. The whole event was from October 20 to 25, 2025 to include travel days from the Philippines and back. The main climb date was from October 22 to 24, 2025.










- 4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?

THE OBJECT OF ROTARY

The object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise, and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

FIRST, the development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;

SECOND, high ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

THIRD, the application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal and community life:

FOURIH, the advancement of international understanding, good will, and peach through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.
