



With the current COVID-19 pandemic, sanitation and good hygiene is very important. However, in Aklan alone, more than 7,000 households still use open pits for toilets. Thus, to help address this problem, the Rotary Club of Metro Kalibo launched "Project Toilet" which aims to provide water tanks, toilets, and water pumps in the poorest villages in Aklan.
